APPD Spring 2023 Prize For Graduate Students/Post-docs

The Aufzien Family Center for the Prevention and Treatment of Parkinson's Disease awards students at Tel Aviv University for research in fields related to mechanisms, diagnosis, treatment and prevention of Parkinson's Disease.

Student applicants must be official M.Sc. or Ph.D. student, or postdoc fellows at Tel Aviv University with research in the field of Parkinson's Disease, through academic year 2022-2023 semester 2. Only one applicant and one paper from each lab will be considered. Papers can be submitted if they have been published or accepted for publication during the years 2021-2023.

Awardees will be selected based on quality of the paper published judged by IF of the journal it was published in (with emphasis on publications in research on PD). Two student/post doc awardees will receive a one-time scholarship in the amount of 5,000 shekels.

Student applications (in English) should include:

- 1) CV and list of publications
- 2) A 200-word summary stating the relevance of the applicant's research to the field of **Parkinson's Disease**
- 3) One letter of recommendation (to be sent separately with the applicant's name as the file name)

Applications (without letter of recommendation) should be sent as a single PDF file by April 15, 2023, to Dr. Keren Shatzman (kersha@tauex.tau.ac.il) with subject line "APPD Spring 2023 Prize" and the applicant's name.
